	completed by parents and/or caregivers which provides an assessment of within-child protective	
	factors central to social and emotional health and resilience in toddlers ages 18 to 36 months. The	
	DECA-T is part of the Devereux Early Childhood Assessment Program for Infants and Toddlers (DECA-	
	I/T) which includes the Devereux Early Childhood Assessment for Infants (DECA-I), an assessment for	
	infants ages 4 week to 18 months.

Raters	Raters fall into two categories: 1) parents, guardians, other family caregivers or family child care	
	providers who observe the child in a homelike setting; and 2) teachers or other childcare and	
	education professionals who see the child in a child care program or infant toddler program.	
	Observation of the toddler over a 4 week period is necessary to complete the assessment. No	
	specific training required to rate the child.

Reading level Used as an assessment and/or screening tool?	<ul> <li>Self-Regulation: The toddler's ability to use independent thought and action to meet his or her needs – 7 items</li> <li>Attachment/Relationships: The mutual, strong, long-lasting relationship between the toddler and significant adults such as family members, and teachers – 18 items</li> <li>Sixth-grade</li> <li>The DECA-T can be used as a screening tool or an assessment tool, depending on the process and purpose for which it is used. If the DECA-T is used as part of a surveillance process to globally identify children's strengths as well as which toddlers may need further observation or assessment, then it is being used as a screener. If the DECA-T is used to assess, interpret and plan for the growth of a toddler's protective factors across time, it is being used as part of an assessment process.</li> </ul>
<u>Psychometrics</u>	Reliability: Internal reliability/Consistency –Total Protective Factor (TPF) coefficients for parent raters on the Toddler Form were .94; and coefficients for teacher raters were .95. These figures meet or exceed the recommended minimum standard—Details in User's Manual.  Test-retest reliability – Significant at the p < .001 level. TPF coefficients for parent raters ranged from .9299; and teacher raters ranged from .7298).  Inter-rater reliability – Ssignificant at the p < .01 level. Total Protective Factors scale correlations ranged from .6272 for parent raters; and the range was .66 to .74 for teacher raters.  Validity:  Content validity – High, based on literature review of resilience literature related to young children, focus groups with parents, teachers, and infant and early childhood mental health professionals, as well as careful review of other infant and toddler social and emotional assessments. Finally, the
	DCRC staff and a National Advisory Board provided additional feedback that shaped assessment items and scales.  Criterion validity – The DECA-I/T has shown significant differences between scores of infants and

	toddlers in an "identified sample" (those with emotional and behavioral disturbance) versus the
	"community sample" (their non-identified peers).
	Construct validity – Using the sister tool of the DECA-I/T, the DECA (for ages 2-5), data was matched
	between 2 year olds using each assessment tool. The DECA-T was found to have strong convergent
	validity with the DECA. Due to the similarity in scale structure and items, there is a level of
	confidence regarding convergence evidence of the DECA-I as well.
Standardization sample	Final sample for both the DECA-I and DECA-T included 2,183 children ages 4 weeks to 36 months
	(45% infants and 55% toddlers), representative of US Population based on the following factors: age,
	gender, geographic region of residence, race ethnicity, and socioeconomic status.
Administration Time	The assessment items take approximately 5-10 minutes to complete in the paper version. Time is
	reduced to 3-5 minutes with use of the web-based version. Visit <u>www.e-deca2.org</u> for more

Results and Basic Interpretation	Raw scale scores, Percentile ranks and T-scores are provided for each scale (Initiative, Self-Regulation,
Descriptions, Standard scores	Attachment/Relationships) and for Total Protective Factors. Scale score results range from Area of

	Protective Factor scales. Results are provided at the individual and group levels via the Individual
	Child Profile and the Group/Classroom Profile.

	Pretest-Posttest Comparisons.
Strategies/Planning	Results from the DECA-T lead to strength-based planning at the Child, Group, and Program levels.
	The DECA-T is part of a comprehensive system of assessment and planning. Research informed
	classroom and home-based strategies that families and caregivers can use to support a child's DECA-T
